# ONLINE SAFETY ACT

## **MAY 2018**

DCMS publishes the <u>Green Paper response</u>; Matt Hancock (then SofS) <u>commits to legislation</u>. THIS TIMELINE SETS OUT THE KEY POLICY AND LEGISLATIVE EVENTS FROM THE START OF THE UK GOVERNMENT'S POLICY DEVELOPMENT THROUGH TO ROYAL ASSENT FOR THE ONLINE SAFETY BILL.

#### **OCT 2017**

DCMS (under SofS Karen Bradley) publishes the Internet Safety Strategy Green Paper

### **APRIL 2019**

DCMS (under SofS Jeremy Wright) and HO (under Home Secretary Sajid Javid) jointly publish the <u>Online Harms White Paper</u> for consultation. The proposals are underpinned by the "duty of care" framework developed by Carnegie UK.

#### **FEB 2020**

DCMS (under SofS Nicky Morgan) and HO (under Home Secretary Priti Patel) publish an <u>"initial</u> <u>response"</u> to the White Paper consultation

### **DEC 2020**

DCMS (under SofS Oliver Dowden) and HO (under Priti Patel) publish the full response to the Online Harms White Paper alongside interim codes of practice on terrorism content and CSEA.

## **MAY 2021**

The <u>Draft Online Safety Bill</u> is published and a joint committee set up to undertake pre-legislative scrutiny.

### **DEC 2021**

The Joint Committee <u>publish their</u> report on the Draft Online Safety Bill.

## **MARCH 2022**

The Government (under DCMS SofS Nadine Dorries) <u>publishes its</u> <u>response</u> to the Joint Committee.

#### **MAY 2022**

**DEC 2022** 

The <u>Online Safety Bill</u> is introduced into the Commons and enters into a <u>Public Bill Committee</u>

## **JULY 2022**

The Online Safety Bill completes the <u>first stage</u> <u>of Commons Report</u> before being pulled in the throes of the Conservative leadership crisis.

#### The Government

The Government (under DCMS SofS Michelle Donelan) removes the adult safety duties and recommits the Bill to Committee consideration.

#### **JAN 2023**

A revised <u>Online Safety Bill</u> enters the Lords; a three-month <u>Committee stage</u> starts in April, with <u>Report</u> completed in July.

# SEPT 2023

The Bill returns to the Commons and proceeds to Royal Assent.

# OCT 2023

Royal Assent confirmed: the <u>Online Safety</u>
<u>Act 2023</u> comes into force
